

2024 Eastern Bay Women's Impact Fund: update

The Eastern Bay Women's Impact Fund is a women's collective giving circle, committed to enabling transformative change in the Eastern Bay of Plenty region. This group of women come together with a powerful shared purpose: committed to improving the future of women and children in the region. In 2023 the Eastern Bay Women's Impact Fund committed \$21,500 towards the installation of a SOZO Lymphoedema assessment & treatment machine at Whakatane Hospital and \$21,500 towards the building of a purpose built ablution block at EBOP Riding for the Disabled. In 2022 the Eastern Bay Women's impact Fund awarded Plunket sufficient funds to setup a women's postnatal mental health support system, supporting mums, babies and families in our rural communities.
