This fund is managed by the Eastern Bay Community Foundation, assisting the *Friends of Thornton Park* to build resources, and to enhance the life experiences of the residents of Thornton Park, working alongside the staff to deliver greater connection to our residents year on year.

Opotiki Arts Society Endowment Fund



As Opotiki Arts head towards their 50th year, the members have made the decision to launch an endowment fund, to ensure a thriving arts community within the Opotiki District can be sustained.

Building a thriving arts community is the key driver behind setting up this fund to ensure a space and a place to nurture artistic talent, to support young up and coming artists in all disciplines to broaden their capability, and to provide scope for art projects int he community to flourish and grow.

Launching officially in 1977, the Opotiki Arts Society has become, over the past 47years, a place and space for connection and learning from established artists and those dipping their brush in the pot, or hands in the clay for the very first time. The goal of the Society is to have a \$50,000 fund by 2027 - to mark their Golden Anniversary.

This fund will provide a steady income to meet the costs of tutors who can assist members and associates to broaden their capability and explore new artistic horizons.

Eastern Bay Women's impact fund – empowering women to transform lives in our community.

The Eastern Bay of Plenty Community Foundation launched a Eastern Bay Women's Impact Fund in 2022. A Giving Circle of local women.

Giving circles offer an opportunity to give, and in the case of the Eastern Bay Women's Impact Fund women giving to help local women and children.

After being involved with Eastern Bay Women's Impact Fund supporters are more educated about local issues and community needs, feel empowered to give for charitable purposes, feel more engaged with community organisations and women with similar goals.

Funds like this have been set up all around the world and this fund was created for the benefit of women and children in our Eastern Bay of Plenty community.

When a collective of 50 plus local women come together to pool their donations, that is when a real impact can be made to projects in our community and make an impactful change for women and children in our communities. In 2022 we had over 50 women who donated \$1,000 each and Whanau Awhina Plunket was the chosen recipient of this fund. Their impactful project was called 'Connecting Mothers' a pilot programme reaching mothers in rural areas to lift and improve their mental health and wellbeing.

In 2023 the Eastern Bay Women's Impact fund donations went to two local charities EBOP Riding for the Disabled for an accessible toilet/bathroom facility.

And to the SOZO project, a Lymphoedema screening and prevention machine to be housed at Whakatane Hospital. People will no longer need to travel to Tauranga for this essential support/healthcare.


All Women's Impact fund donations are passed onto the recipient of the fund that year and people who donate are involved in the process of choosing the recipients, prior to the funds being distributed that year.

Donors get to choose/vote where the money goes!

We have just launched this year's 2024 Eastern Bay Women's Impact fund and already have over \$15,000 donated.
